SHARE THE TRAIL

- Stay on designated trail.
- Keep right so others can pass.
- Keep pets on leash/Dispose of waste.
- Obey traffic signs and rules.
- Pack out all garbage and litter.
- Respect adjoining landowner's rights and privacy.
- Warn other trail users when passing by giving an audible signal.
- Overnight camping and campfires are permitted only on designated campsites. Do not leave them unattended.
- Enjoy the beauty of wild plants and animals, but leave them undisturbed for all to enjoy.
- Trail users are legally responsible for obeying the rules and regulations provided in Minnesota Rules, 6100.3000.

ABOUT THE TRAIL

The 1.4 mile Camp Ripley/Veterans State Trail connects Charles A. Lindbergh State Park and Mill Park in the City of Little Falls. The paved trail follows the west side of the Mississippi River and aligns with the Mississippi River Trail (MRT). In the summer, the developed trail is popular for hiking, bicycling and in-line skating.

As one of the oldest towns in Minnesota, established in 1848, Little Falls offers visitors an experience rich in history and culture. Draws of

the area include festivals, concerts, art exhibits, museums, attractions, outdoor recreation, dining and shopping experiences.


Charles A. Weyerhauser Memorial Museum and Charles Lindbergh House and Museum are popular attractions located near Charles A. Lindbergh State Park.
