Introducing the future of outdoor licensing in Minnesota.

Electronic licensing made easy for hunters, anglers and other users of the outdoors! To meet the needs of today's customers, a new Minnesota DNR licensing system and mobile app are coming soon, offering outdoor enthusiasts more options for on-the-go licensing.

Purchase and access licenses anytime, anywhere:

- You will have the option to buy licenses and permits in the new MN DNR licensing mobile app, in the new online system, or in-person from a license agent.
- There are three convenient ways to receive and store license products, all of which can be used for a license check in the field.



Mobile app—Licenses can be stored digitally in the mobile app.

- Internet connection is needed to download the app, log in and purchase a license, but not to store and display licenses once logged in.



Email—Customers who provide an email address can have a digital file (PDF) of their license emailed to them to save on their device.



Paper—Licenses may be printed on standard paper, either at license agent locations or at home after an online purchase.

- The “linked accounts” feature offers a simplified process to purchase license products for family members.

Register a harvest anytime, anywhere:

- You will have the option to validate and register harvests in the new MN DNR licensing mobile app, in the new online system, or in-person with a license agent.
- With the new app, you can begin your harvest validation, even when offline or out of service. Initiate the validation and registration process in the field and complete it when you're back online.
- Physical, printed harvest tags will no longer be used. Those who opt to register a harvest in-person will use a plain paper validation.
- When you buy your license online for an activity that previously required a tag, you will no longer need to wait for your license and tag to be mailed, thanks to the new validation and registration options.

After initial launch: additional features to follow

- Renew recreational vehicles and watercraft online, in the new MN DNR licensing mobile app, or in-person at a deputy registrar's office.
- Register for firearms safety and skills training in the same system where you purchase licenses.
