

Permit for the Propagation of Endangered or Threatened Species

Permit Application

An application for a permit for propagation must include the following:

- Name, street address, phone number and email address of the applicant
- Endangered or threatened species proposed for propagation
- A Species Recovery Plan, including:
 - o a review of the biological and ecological characteristics and needs of the species
 - o a review of the historical and current status (i.e., distribution, abundance, and viability) of the species in the state
 - o a review of the current threats to the species
 - o a review of gaps in knowledge of the species' characteristics, needs, status, and threats
 - o a review of past and current conservation efforts directed at the species
 - o a statement of the recovery goal for the species
 - o an outline of recovery actions needed to meet the recovery goal
- A Propagation Plan, including:
 - o the species and number of specimens to be taken from the wild
 - location and date of proposed taking from the wild
 - o conditions and methods under which propagation will occur
 - o location of the proposed propagation facilities
 - o anticipated number of propagules
 - o if propagules are proposed to be released into the wild:
 - location/s of proposed release
 - quantitative information about pre-release habitat and species' population at the release site
 - a risk analysis of potential negative effects on the habitat and the species' population at the release site
 - a plan for monitoring and evaluating both the target species and the recipient habitat following the release.
 - qualifications of the applicant relevant to propagation of endangered or threatened species

Annual Report

Permits required submission of an annual report to the DNR. Failure to submit the report may result in denial of future permit requests.

Criteria for Reviewing Permit Application

- The application demonstrates that propagation is required for the recovery of the species.
- The application presents a propagation plan that is appropriate and achieves the stated recovery goal.
- The application demonstrates that the applicant is qualified to conduct the proposed activity.
