AIS Prevention Aid Metrics 2021

A majority of the counties that receive Aquatic Invasive Species (AIS) Prevention Aid (see map) voluntarily completed and submitted metrics templates—a tool created to help all counties track their accomplishments. These impressive numbers highlight activities funded by AIS Prevention Aid in 2021. Note that in-person activities continue to be limited due COVID-19.



<u>\$8,154,113</u> of AIS Prevention Aid was used by 60 counties in 2021 to fund these activities:

<u>1,493</u> people doing AIS work, including
<u>976</u> jobs and <u>5,618</u> hours served by
<u>517</u> volunteers.
<u>289</u> lake associations, <u>40</u> conservation
groups, <u>270</u> businesses, <u>55</u> schools/
youth organizations and <u>158</u> local
governments are involved.
<u>36</u> Counties have AIS Task Forces and

Committees.

25 counties spent \$578,673 and leveraged \$386,127 for invasive aquatic plant management on 197 lakes in partnership with 147 lake organizations.

<u>130</u> local officers were trained on AIS laws. <u>100</u> local law enforcement officers actively enforced AIS laws in <u>17</u> counties and contacted <u>2,176</u> boaters.

39 counties hired 702 Level 1 and 110 Level 2 inspectors. They worked 202,300 hours, performed 402,611 inspections, operated 39 decon units, performed 2,886 decontaminations, and covered 777 accesses on 629 water bodies. 32 County grant programs awarded \$1,831,794 to 188 organizations. \$1,472,105 in additional funds were leveraged from 209 organizations to directly support aid-funded work.

29,047 residents and visitors reached about AIS during <u>180</u> events.
<u>7,808</u> children were taught about AIS.
<u>23</u> counties posted AIS information on social media. The <u>365</u> posts were seen by over <u>2 million</u> followers.

Funds Leveraged

44 counties surveyed 698 lakes and rivers for AIS. They conducted 702 early detection surveys, 432 aquatic plant surveys, deployed 491 zebra mussel settling plates and conducted 245 veliger tows.

\$1,510,399 is saved in a contingency fund (over multiple years, for a variety of activities) by <u>31</u> counties. <u>16</u> counties have new infestation response plans.
