

General Permit: Authorization to Transport Yard Waste with Jumping Worms

Who needs to follow this general permit

If you have organic material (yard waste) that is from a site with jumping worms (*Amynthas* and/or *Metaphire* species) and you are transporting the material to a composting site for disposal purposes you need to follow the conditions below.

How to use this general permit

You do not need to keep a copy of this permit. You need to read and follow the permit conditions below. Please check the DNR's <u>invasive species permit website</u> and sign up for permit updates to learn about changes to this permit.

Scope:

This general permit authorizes landowners or their designee to transport: (1) organic material (e.g. yard waste); and/or (2) jumping worms (*Amynthas* and/or *Metaphire species*); from landowner property to a composting site for disposal purposes. The composting site must follow the process for further reducing pathogens (PFRP). The PFRP involves heating materials to 131°F and maintaining the temperature over time according to one of the three methods of PFRP described in <u>Minnesota Rules</u>, <u>section 7035.2836 Subp. 5 (I)</u>. This permit does not authorize you to take yard waste materials to a landfill; see <u>Best Practices for Disposing of Materials Infested with Jumping Worms</u> for information on landfill disposal.

Permit Conditions:

The property owner or his/her designee must take the following measures to prevent the spread of invasive jumping worm species during transport and disposal activities covered under this permit:

- confirm that the disposal site follows PFRP;
- secure the organic material in a covered trailer, closed container or use another method that ensures that the material will not fall out during transport;
- lawfully dispose of organic material at a composting site that has agreed to accept the material and follows the PFRP; and
- brush off all hauling equipment (e.g., trailer, pickup truck, tarp) before leaving the disposal site.
