Floating-leaf Plants (Plants with leaves that float on the water surface)

<i>Brasenia schreberi</i>	Water shield
<i>Nymphaea odorata</i> ssp. <i>tuberosa</i>	White Water Lily
<i>Persicaria amphibia</i>	Water smartweed
<i>Potamogeton epihydrus</i>	Ribbon-leaved Pondweed
<i>Potamogeton gramineus</i>	Variable Pondweed
<i>Sparganium angustifolium</i>	Narrow Floatingleaf Burreed
<i>Sparganium fluctuans</i>	Wide Floatingleaf Burreed

Emergent Plants (Plants with leaves extending above the water surface)

<i>Acorus americanus</i>	Sweet Flag
<i>Bolboschoenus fluviatilis</i>	River Bulrush
<i>Carex utriculata</i>	Beaked Sedge, Bottle-shaped
<i>Dulichium arundinaceum</i>	Three-way sedge
<i>Eleocharis palustris</i>	Small's Spikerush
<i>Glyceria borealis</i>	Northern manna grass
<i>Juncus filiformis</i>	Species of rush
<i>Phragmites australis</i>	Common reed grass, Cane
<i>Sagittaria latifolia</i>	Broad-leaved Arrowhead
<i>Schoenoplectus acutus</i> var. <i>acutus</i>	Hard-stem bulrush
<i>Schoenoplectus tabernaemontani</i>	Soft-stem bulrush
<i>Sparganium emersum</i>	Green-fruited Burreed

Shoreline Plants (Plants associated with the wetland habitat)

<i>Alnus incana</i> ssp. <i>rugosa</i>	Speckled alder
<i>Eleocharis acicularis</i>	Needle Spike-rush
<i>Eupatorium perfoliatum</i>	Common boneset
<i>Impatiens capensis</i>	Jewelweed, Spotted touch-me-not
<i>Iris versicolor</i>	Blue Flag
<i>Lysimachia terrestris</i>	Swamp Candles, Loosestrife
<i>Phalaris arundinacea</i>	Reed canary grass
<i>Triadenum fraseri</i>	Marsh St. John's-wort
