Benton County has very few lakes. Its surface is composed mainly of gently rolling ground moraine which was deposited by the Pierz ice lobe, which entered this county from the east. The western portion of the county contains outwash deposits associated with glacial drainages along the Mississippi River valley. Granite rock crops out in this locality or is close to the surface. Such terrain is not conducive to the formation of lakes. Little Rock, 5-13, is the largest lake with an area of 1,259 acres.
