

## Little Rock Creek Area: Kimley-Horn progress report

Kimley-Horn and Associates, Inc. has prepared a progress report for review by interested stakeholders. This progress report includes details about the project, stakeholder input, and Kimley Horn's initial assessment of several proposed solutions. The progress report represents work completed through early April 2025. Kimley-Horn is continuing to get feedback and answer questions from growers in the area and will incorporate that feedback in future design revisions and analyses later in 2025.

- The DNR will extend the contract with Kimley-Horn and Partner Limno-Tech to complete a final report by spring of 2026.
- Kimley-Horn will hold off on completing any further designs and evaluations until after the 2025 harvest season and will continue to gather feedback from stakeholders.
- Kimley-Horn and the DNR will plan to meet in person with Stakeholders in November 2025 to review
  modeling results and design modifications, and to discuss proposed solutions, new considerations and
  next steps.
