<p>Task Force Purpose: The purpose of the Task Force is to develop design principles and concept-level engineering solutions to achieve balanced flood risk management for the Fargo-Moorhead region, including up- and downstream communities and properties.</p>		
<p>Key Parameters:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1) Find solutions within the parameters established by applicable Minnesota, North Dakota & local law. 2) Maintain federal authorization and associated funding for permanent flood protection, unless more expedient and low-cost options are presented that provide protection for a one percent chance flood (i.e. 100-year flood as determined by the Task Force) accreditation by FEMA under the National Flood Insurance Program.
