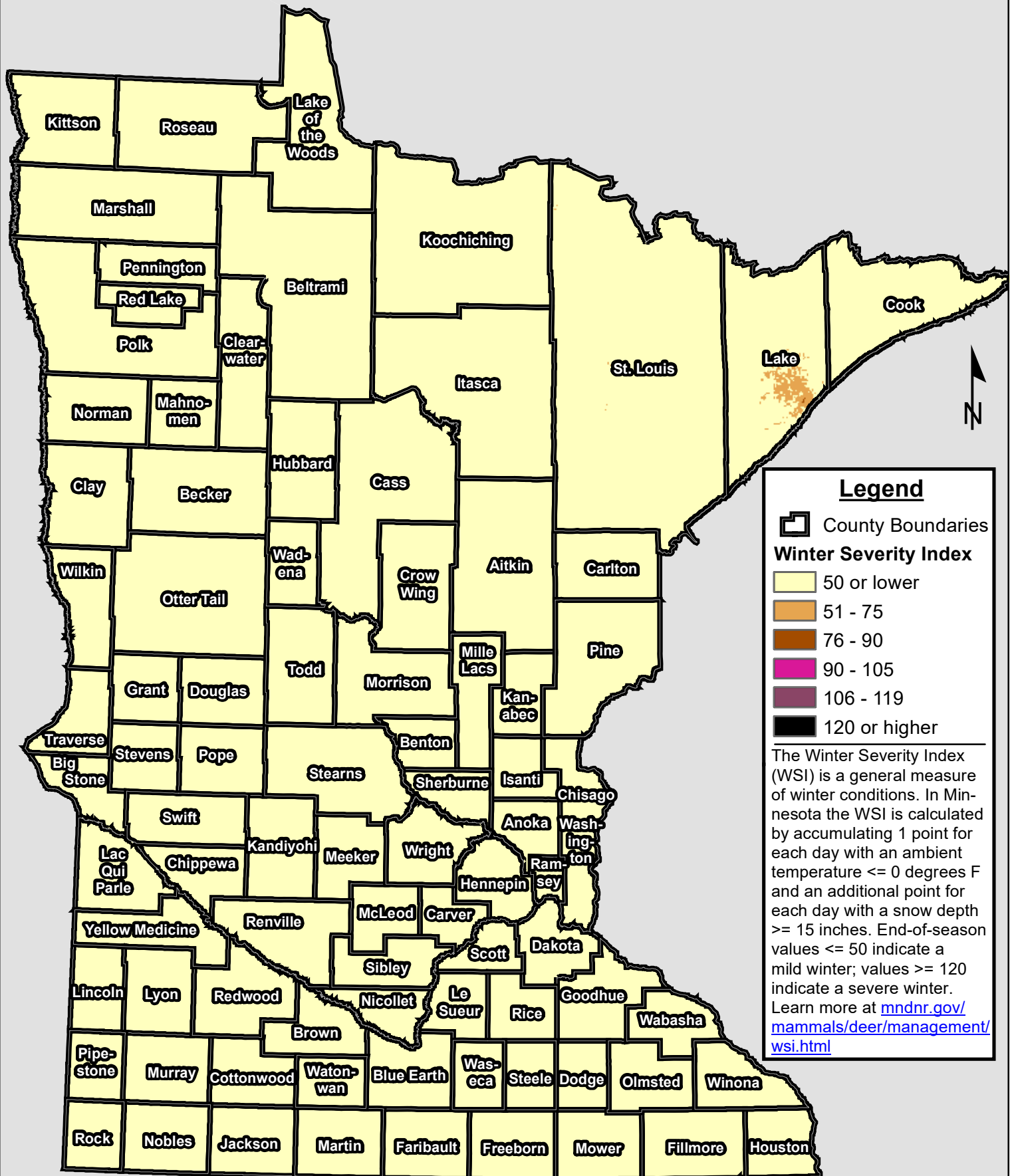


Winter Severity Index

- 50 or lower
- 51 - 75

- 106 - 119
- 120 or higher

The Winter Severity Index (WSI) is a general measure of winter conditions. In Minnesota the WSI is calculated by accumulating 1 point for each day with an ambient temperature ≤ 0 degrees F and an additional point for each day with a snow depth ≥ 15 inches. End-of-season values ≤ 50 indicate a mild winter; values ≥ 120 indicate a severe winter. Learn more at mndnr.gov/mammals/deer/management/wsi.html
