DPAs: 255, 343 and 344	CWD has been found in captive deer in this area and the DNR is gathering information here to determine if CWD is in wild deer in the area. DPAs: 277 and 283 east of State Trunk Highway 4; 219 south of State Trunk Highway 55; and 285 north of State Trunk Highway 7
