Deer	The DNR wants your comments on these proposed changes to Minnesota's waterfowl hunting regulations:
Elk	 Increasing the Canada goose bag limit to five birds per day for the entire season;
Grouse	 Extending legal shooting hours to sunset for the entire season, eliminating the 4 p.m. early season closure; Implementing a five-day early teal season (Sept. 4 - Sept. 8) as an experimental regulation for up to three
Moose	years;
Mourning dove	 Allowing statewide over-water goose hunting during the early September season; and Establishing season dates through the 2024 season for the north, central and south waterfowl hunting
Nongame wildlife	zones.

Regulation Changes Considered

- Season dates and/or zones
- Early teal OR bonus teal limit
- Change 4 pm closure to sunset
- Expand open water duck hunting
- Create a military/veteran's hunt
- Increase Canada goose bag limit to 5
 - already approved by FWS for all states
- Remove restriction on over water goose hunting

- Motorized decoys (current bill in Legislature – <u>SF814</u>)
- Allow trolling motors on Wildlife Management Areas (need legislative action)
- Create a 3-bird splash limit (potential future option)



Waterfowl Regulations Process

- Federal Frameworks for Mississippi Flyway states
- Minnesota state rules and/or statutes
 - States can always use more conservative
- Public input/mail-out surveys
- DNR Waterfowl Committee
- Director, Wildlife Section Management Team
- Commissioner's Office



Proposed regulation changes

- 1. Maintain current 3 zones but use 5 day split in South Zone (instead of 12)
- 2. Implement 5 day early teal season (Sept. 4 Sept. 8)
- 3. Increase Canada goose bag limit to 5 birds/day for the entire season
- 4. Extend shooting hours to sunset (eliminate early season 4 pm closure)
- 5. Allow statewide over-water goose hunting during September season
- **Motorized decoy bill in state Legislature now



Current zones and season splits

History

MN first used zones in 2011

Every 5 years, FWS allows states to modify

States select from 4 options

Current

3 zones (North, Central, South)

North: no split

Central: 5 day split

South: 12 day split



Season date preferences for 2021 by zone

What is your preference for season dates in 2021?	No split	5 day split	12 day split	No pref.
North zone hunters	79	11	7	4
Central zone hunters	37	43	9	10
South zone hunters	25	16	48	11
Hunters with no preference	21	14	8	58

Proposed season dates for 2021

North Zone: Saturday September 25 to Tuesday November 23 (same as last year)

Central Zone:

Same as South Zone

South Zone:

Saturday September 25 to Sunday October 3, <u>close 5 days</u>, reopen Saturday October 9 to Sunday November 28

Rationale:

- Lost opportunity in October with long 12 day split
- Usually frozen in South Zone before season ends



Teal seasons

History

1965-1967: Flyway-wide experiment

MN: Only season was 1965

2.5 days (noon Saturday-sunset Monday)

1969: MN, WI, MI, IA declared "production" states and not allowed early teal season

Current

2014-2016: "Production" states allowed 3 year experimental teal season (MN did not participate)

Teal season regulations: up to 16 days from Sept. 1-30; up to 6 teal/day

Spy blind data required

Criteria: attempt rates at non-targets (non-teal) <25%

WI, MI, IA (2014-2016): 5.5%

2 bonus blue-winged teal

History

- FWS discontinued "bonus" seasons in 1991
- But in 2014, states were allowed to use 2 bonus blue-winged teal in lieu of teal season
 - First 16 days of duck season
 - Duck 7 and 8 do not have to be blue-wings if you already have blue-wings in your bag

Current

- Can be used in lieu of teal season
- Used in ND, SD, MT and WY

Current teal and bonus blue-winged teal seasons



Proposed teal season for 2021

• Season dates (5 days): Saturday Sept. 4-Wed. Sept. 8

- Bag limit: 6 teal (blue-winged, green-winged, cinnamon combined)
- Shooting hours: Sunrise to sunset
- 3 year experimental season (with spy blinds)

Rationale:

- Supported by hunters and public input;
- Provides additional opportunity;
- 3 weeks prior to duck opener to minimize disturbance;
- Experimental so could discontinue any year

Increase Canada goose bag limit to 5/day

Current

- Current bag limits: 5/day in Sept.; 3 day for remainder of season
- In 2021, all states in Mississippi Flyway are allowed 5 Canada geese/day entire season

Rationale

- Provides additional opportunity
- Simplifies regulations
- Goose population remains high in MN/Flyway
- Well supported by hunters and public input

Proposed shooting hours: end at sunset for entire season

History

- 4 pm closure used in MN since 1973 for all or portions of duck season
- Initiated when breeding duck numbers were very low and hunter numbers and harvest very high
- Extends through Friday nearest Oct. 8 now

Rationale:

- Provides additional opportunity
- Simplifies regulations
- Well supported by hunters and public input

Allow overwater goose hunting statewide in September

History

• Restricted statewide when early Sept. seasons started in 1987

Current

• No hunting within 100 yards of surface water in NW zone, Carlos Avery WMA, Swan lake, and Ocheda refuge

Rationale

- Provides additional opportunity
- Simplifies regulations
- Well supported by hunters and public input
- Will have to drop if teal season opens

Motorized decoys: Legislative item

History

- First restricted in MN in 2002
- Initial concerns over effectiveness and increased harvest and/or increased use by hunters

Current

- No motorized decoys through Sat. nearest Oct. 8 and on state WMAs season-long
- Current bill in Legislature <u>SF814</u>





Regulations considered but not recommended for change

- Expanded open water duck hunting
- Active duty military/veteran's hunt
- Allow trolling motors on state Wildlife Management Areas (WMAs)
- 3 bird splash duck limit (no species/sex restrictions)

Open water duck hunting: no change

History

• Restricted in MN since 1915

Current

- Must be in partially concealing vegetation
- In 2014, allowed on Mille Lacs, Lake Pepin, Lake Superior, and Lake of the Woods

Rationale

• Very few requests from hunters to consider expanding to other lakes/statewide



Military/veteran's hunt: no change

History

- Authorized by US Congress in 2019
- Up to 2 day hunt for active duty military and veteran's
- Could overlap with Youth Waterfowl Weekend or be separate weekend

Rationale

 Supported by hunters and public input, but user groups (active military/veteran's) do not feel it is necessary

Trolling motors on WMAs: no change

History

 Motors (including trolling motors) restricted on state WMAs for decades (minor exceptions)

Rationale

- May need legislative action
- Need broader engagement with other WMA usergroups (anglers, wild rice harvesters, canoe and kayak users, wildlife viewers, etc.)



3-splash duck limit: no change

Current

- Will be used in South Dakota and Nebraska this fall for 3 year pilot program
- Hunters choose 1 of 2 licenses at time of purchase: Tier 1 (normal) or Tier 2 (3 duck limit)
- Could be a future recruitment tool

Rationale

 Not an option for Mississippi Flyway states at present but could be in the future



Timeline on proposed regulation changes

- March 29 April 11: Public comments
- Late April: Internal review
- Early summer: Finalize fall 2021 waterfowl season
- July: Waterfowl supplement online and at vendors
